RE: SUSTAINABLE DESIGN STRATEGIES FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER (LEC) ADDITION

WHEREAS, the resolution approving the addition to the LEC did not include pursuit of Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification; and,

WHEREAS, La Crosse County Eco-County designation endorses the principles of sustainable development and supports the application of these principles whenever possible; and,

WHEREAS, LEED building certification would provide independent recognition of building operation efficiency and recognition of the project in accordance with a nationally recognized standard of environmentally sustainable building construction.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Architect is authorized to incorporate the following specific sustainable design strategies into the construction documents that will be used by the Construction Manager to obtain construction bids on the LEC addition. The sustainable design strategies have been developed based upon the identified Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) categories and credit numbers.

The Project's Construction Documents shall be prepared with the following sustainable design strategies incorporated into the base building construction bid, estimated cost as follows:

Re: New Draft Resolution SUSTANABLE DESIGN STRATEGIES FOR LAW

ENFORCEMENT CENTER (LEC) ADDITION

The attached resolution has re-worked the project estimates into a format that will permit the incorporation of LEED design elements to be included in the bid documents, so that final decisions are based on actual bids received.

First, you will notice that the Architects identified an estimated \$300,903 in sustainable design strategies that would be added to the base design. These are primarily energy saving items that would be very difficult to remove from the bid as an alternate at a later time.

Second, there are two groups of add alternate bids to be sought:

- 1) Sustainable Design Strategies of \$338,000
- 2) Finish of Probation and Parole of \$499,500

Remember, depending upon final actual bids, if these costs go over the \$29.5 million, the County Board could choose to fund these alternates from the General Fund; or in the case of Probation and Parole, the build out could be directly funded by the lease payments. Or the County Board could choose to cut any combination of add alternates from the bid award.

Finally, as described in the Footnote, if the County Board decides to pursue LEED certification after receiving the bids, the remaining work could be bid and added at that time.

I believe this new resolution provides the maximum degree of flexibility to consider the decision on LEED certification based on actual bids received.
