PANDEMIC UPDATE:

Vaccination Rates:

- Residents that are vaccinated:
 - o 96% Hillview
 - o 92% of Lakeview
- Staff that have at least one vaccine in the COVID-19
 - 92% Hillview
 - 91% Lakeview

<u>County Transmission & Positivity Rates:</u> With the County transmission rate still in a high category, we continue to follow enhanced source control with mask and eye wear protection, social distance and monitor all infection control procedures with residents, staff, and visitors.

VACCINATION MANDATE UPDATE:

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), in collaboration with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), announced its Omnibus COVID-19 Health Care Staff Vaccination Interim Final Rule ("Interim Final Rule") emergency regulations, requiring vaccinations for health care staff as a condition for participating in the Medicare and Medicaid programs. The decision was based on the continued and growing spread of the COVID-19 virus in health care settings. All staff, including volunteers, board members, and vendors will need to have at least the first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine by December 6th unless granted a religious or medical exemption. To date, approximately 12 individuals have requested exemptions. These exemptions are being reviewed by the LaCrosse County Human Resource department.

With the rapid implementation of this mandate, it is expected that our staffing challenges will dramatically increase. Department managers are modifying their emergency crisis staffing plans to address these expected vacancies.

NOTE: A federal judge in Louisiana Tuesday granted a <u>preliminary injunction</u> against the Biden administration's COVID-19 regulation. It encompasses all states "due to a need for uniformity." We are moving forward with implementation of this mandate despite this injunction in order to ensure we are prepared.

RE: AUTHORIZATION TO TRANSFER \$200,000 FROM CARROLL HEIGHTS CASH BALANCE TO A NEW FUND CALLED "THE OAKS" - A STATE ONLY LICENSED NURSING HOME AS PART OF THE HILLVIEW CAMPUS

WHEREAS, Hillview Health Care Center, in collaboration with La Crosse County Human Services Department and local hospitals, has identified a need to provide care to individuals with significant behavioral symptoms; and,

WHEREAS, these individuals include seniors with dementia, mental illness, and those in need of crisis stabilization; and,

WHEREAS, La Crosse County already has experience in operating "Ravenwood", a state only licensed nursing home on the Lakeview Campus which serves a similar population; and,

WHEREAS, Hillview Health Care Center staff have applied with the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services for a license to operate a State only nursing home to support our local community in meeting gaps in care; and,

WHEREAS, the plan is to convert one hallway within the walls of the current Hillview Health Care Center into this 10-bed facility, with remodeling and start-up costs estimated to be \$200,000.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that \$200,000 be transferred from Carroll Heights cash balance to a new fund called "The Oaks", and the Finance Director is authorized to take the actions necessary to effectuate the purposes of this resolution.

FISCAL NOTE: Transfer \$200,000 from Carroll Heights Fund cash account 618-11101.970 to The Oaks Fund cash account 612-11101.970. The balance in the Carroll Heights cash account as of November 23, 2021 was \$2,374,733.53.
