APPROVE MINUTES:

Veterans Aging & Long-Term Care Committee – October 10, 2022. **MOTION** by Ferries/Mathu to approve the minutes of October 10, 2022. **Motion carried unanimously.**

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

The director's report was distributed to members. Kylee Breaker has been hired as the long term care recruiter. Current needs in nursing staff remains high. The State of Wisconsin is paying for CNA training if you are employed at a nursing home.

CONFERENCE/MEETING REPORT – None.

RESOLUTION RE: AUTHORIZATION TO RECEIVE 2022 AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT HCBS (HOME & COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES) GRANT MONEY

The Lakeview Health Center Assisted Living campus has 3 CBRF's (community based residential facility) that serve Medicaid eligible residents in West Salem. Opportunities for community inclusion have been limited due to access to transportation and medical and social opportunities in a more rural community. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services has awarded the Lakeview Health Center Assisted Living campus an ARPA HCBS (Home & Community Based Services) grant of \$82,485.42 to be used to enhance inclusion opportunities for our assisted living residents, including purchase of a low-profile van and telecommunication equipment. **MOTION** by Ferris and Isola to approve. **Motion carried unanimously**.

VETERAN'S SERVICES UPDATE: Interviews are in process and will be finished this week. Hope to have someone on board quickly.

HILLVIEW PLANNING AND DESIGN UPDATE: Hoffman and Associates provided an update on the current situation. Bids for the project came back very high, almost double what was anticipated. Labor has increased substantially and the availability of materials is an issue. The project is not feasible in the current state. Hoffman is committed to working with the county. Medicaid rates are going up, but it will not cover all costs, assisted living will be an important part of stabilizing operations. In 2018 an evaluation of the building was completed, and the report was 15 million to remodel the building. Over 8 million was HVAC. At that time seemed out of range, but now we may need to rethink. Planning to bring options for the project to the January County Board Advance. This is an opportunity to look at things in a new way. Please let Jane know of any questions you may have. The staff at Hillview has worked very hard to maintain a quality of care.

Lakeview Health Center & Assisted Living Campus

Census in the Lakeview Health Center nursing home impacted in January due to a resident COVID outbreak. All residents are currently out of isolation. This outbreak affected 18 residents located on one neighborhood, two of which were not vaccinated. Most residents experienced mild to moderate symptoms.

The Hillview Health Care Center currently has 75 licensed beds. A move to the West side of the building and the need for more private rooms has created a maximum capacity at this time of 60, and staffing capacity of between 55-60. The Hillview census has averaged a census of less than 60 for the past 6 months and it has been at least 3 months since we had any dates with a census of more than 60. The additional beds on our license has a cost of \$2550/month and there is no plan at this time to maintain a nursing home with over 60 beds. Our plan will be to delicense to 60 beds at an annual savings of \$30,600.

STAFFING UPDATE

Significant staffing challenges continue. One of the identified barriers to our recruitment are the starting wages. For Certified Nursing Assistants, our starting wage is \$16.56 and for our non-certified resident care assistants who work in our assisted living providing personal care, passing medications and completing treatments such as tracheotomy care and wound care, the starting wage is \$15.45. These starting wages have made it almost impossible to attract any candidates. Because of our inability to attract new hires, we have been utilizing contract travel C.N.A.'s at a cost of approximately \$60/hr. We are working with HR, Finance, and Administration at the County level to develop interim strategies to address this challenge. In addition, our HR staff will be completing a wage study of our direct care staff in order to request more permanent changes to these pay classifications in order to better recruit for the limited number of candidates.

NESHONOC MANOR/MAPLEWOOD CBRF SURVEY

The surveyor from the Bureau of Assisted Living was onsite in mid-January to complete the Neshonoc Manor and Maplewood CBRF annual surveys. These surveys went very well with only one pharmacy review citation. This deficiency has been addressed with our pharmacy provider and has been corrected.
