APPROVE THE 2023 WISDOT DISCRETIONARY TRAFFIC MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT STH 33

Under this contract the Highway Department will shoulder STH 33 on the state trunk highway system. This is a revenue contract for \$185,600. The Highway Commissioner recommends approval. **MOTION** by Pogreba/Nikolay to approve. **Motion carried unanimously.**

APPROVE THE 2023 WISDOT DISCRETIONARY TRAFFIC MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT STH 162

Under this contract the Highway Department will shoulder STH 162 on the state trunk highway system. This is a revenue contract for \$103,500. The Highway Commissioner recommends approval. **MOTION** by Pogreba/Hesse to approve. **Motion carried unanimously.**

APPROVAL OF A CULVERT BID

This bid is for the material to replace failed culverts on County roadways. The bid was advertised and sent to seven known suppliers. Four bids were received. The low bid that met the specifications was from Metal Culverts out of Evansville, WI for \$41,938.02. The Highway Commissioner recommends approval. **MOTION** by Pogreba/Jacobsen to approve. **Motion carried unanimously.**

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APPROVAL OF A DOME ROOF REPLACEMENT BID

This bid is for the replacement of the Salt Dome Shed at the West Salem shop. The 2023 budget had a line item for the replacement of \$125,000. The bid was advertised and sent to known suppliers. Ten bids were received and the low bid that met the specifications was from Howe Construction out of West Salem for \$87,000. The Highway Commissioner recommends approval. **MOTION** by Pogreba/Hesse to approve. **Motion carried unanimously.**

APPROVE THE HTP (HARTLAND TEXPAR) ENERGY FUEL CONTRACT

This is an extension of the current fuel contract and is for three years. The per gallon cost includes refinery price, overhead and trucking. The Highway Commissioner recommends approval. **MOTION** by Pogreba/Jacobsen to approve. **Motion carried unanimously.**

APPROVAL OF A CONSULTANT DESIGN CONTRACT

The Highway Department received HSIP (Highway safety improvement) funding from WisDOT to make safety improvements on CTH FO. The contract is with Mead & Hunt for \$40,565.55. The County is responsible for \$4,790 of the contract and the Highway Commissioner recommends approval. **MOTION** by Jacobsen/Pogreba to approve. **Motion carried unanimously.**

DISCUSS THE OPTION OF PURCHASING AN ELECTRIC VEHICLE

The Facilities Department is in need of a new vehicle to replace the 2012 Chevy Colorado that was totaled in an accident earlier this year due to know fault of theirs and are looking at the option of replacing it with an electric vehicle. The Facilities Director is asking for support from this committee to bring this forward to the Executive Committee in June to ask for emergency funds. Discussion ensued. **MOTION** by Doyle/Pogreba to approve bringing this forward to the Executive Committee. **Motion carried unanimously.**

RESOLUTION RE: INCREASING FUNDS FOR HIGHWAY AND BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION IN THE 2024 PROPOSED BUDGET

MOTION by Jacobsen/Pogreba to approve.

La Crosse County is responsible for 281 miles of county highway and 72 bridges and over the last 10 years has completed 62 miles of highway construction projects. State funding has failed to keep up with rising material and labor costs for highway projects, which have increased by 140% since 2018 and close to 250% since 1999. Levy limits make it increasingly difficult for local governments to make up for the shortfall in state funding. The La Crosse County Board directs the County Administrator to prepare the 2024 Administrator's proposed budget with \$10 million allocated to the Highway Department for highway and bridge construction. Fiscal Note: The fiscal impact to add \$3 million of project costs to the Highway Department in 2024 is dependent on the funding source identified. Funding options include: 1.) Borrowing \$3 million of general obligation debt, 2.) Utilizing general fund balance which would reduce the fund balance by 8% to \$14 million unassigned, 3.) Reserving American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funds if not allocated to other projects, or 4.) Directing the county administrator to reduce other departmental funding which could negatively impact other county services. Discussion ensued. MOTION by Geary and seconded by Pogreba to strike the word "directs" in the now therefore be it resolved and replace it with "recommends". Motion carries. MOTION by Jacobsen to amend the resolution to include the following changes. Revise the first whereas clause to read: La Crosse County is responsible for 281 miles of county highway and 72 bridges and over the last 11 years has completed 62 miles (5.6 miles per year) of highway construction projects.

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Additional whereas clause: Whereas, the La Crosse County roadway work funding the last 11 years totaled \$31,511,120 (\$2,864,644 per year);

Additional whereas clause: Whereas: the State of Wisconsin's cost sharing funding for county road work is sharply increased for the next three years; and

Revised the sixth whereas clause to read 44% (124 miles) of La Crosse County highways have a pavement condition rating index of "good," 37% (104 miles) are in "fair" condition, and 19% (53 miles) are in "poor" condition; and seconded by Pogreba. **Motion to amend the amendment carries.**

POSSIBLE CHANGES TO S. 7.08 LA CROSSE COUNTY ORDINANCE ("ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES")

Chair Viner spoke on the sections in the existing ordinance that are up for changes and stated the importance of having a clear policy as guidance. Concerns were brought up with how residents are to receive information that this is something being looked at in order to provide concerns and feedback. Discussion ensued.

Landfill Expansion Process

Background:

In 2019, the Department initiated the process of a vertical and horizontal expansion of the landfill to permit approximately an additional 15 years of airspace. Under current operation fill rates available airspace would be utilized by 2033.

Key expansion goals:

- Increase current projected site life by at least 14 years. We requested 3.1 million cubic yards of additional airspace. This would bring total facility MSW airspace to approximately 8.8 million cubic yards.
- Minimize impact to surrounding natural areas and major travel corridors including Interstate 90, STH16 and surrounding neighborhoods and business park.
- Provide the region long-term waste management stability along with support of regional recycling goals and onsite diversion programs.
 - Xcel Energy French Island Waste-to-Energy Facility will be critical to maximizing the projected usable airspace. Current contract runs until 2030

Additional Items:

Industrial Wastewater Discharge Permit: Representatives from the City of La Crosse and the La Crosse County Solid Waste Department met in 2020 to discuss the draft for an industrial wastewater discharge permit for the landfill's leachate. The need for a discharge permit was determined based on the following: requirements of Federal pretreatment regulations 40 CFR 403, Chapter NR 211 Wisconsin Administrative Code and compliance with Chapter 46 Article II Division 2 of the Municipal Code of Ordinances for the City of La Crosse; changes to the Departments responsibilities; and anticipated changes to the discharge infrastructure of the landfill.

Leachate Direct Connect: In 2020, the Solid Waste Department (Department) initiated the process of redesigning the leachate discharge system for the landfill. Leachate system operation was changed from large capacity underground storage tanks to a direct connection with the City of La Crosse. Approvals for this program change were received by the City of La Crosse WWTP and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources in 2021. System operation/design is reflected in POO approval.

Clay Borrow: The La Crosse County Solid Waste Department purchased ~ 50,000 CY of NR504 quality clay in 2021 to address clay volume requirements. Site preparation and excavation of the material, along with preparation of the stockpiling location at the landfill, was completed in late 2021.

Site Access Road: In order to facilitate the expansion process construction of a primary access road for landfill traffic needed to be installed along Phase VIII Mod B. Scheduled to be completed in July of 2023.

La Crosse County ATV/UTV Routes Survey Report

OVERVIEW

How many people took the survey?

We had **950 participants**. The survey opened on April 13 and closed May 4.

How was the survey distributed?

The survey was shared on the county's Facebook page, where it reached over **12,000 people** (and was shared by the Village of West Salem, City of Onalaska, various ATV clubs and by many county residents). It also was promoted in the **La Crosse Tribune** and through the county's employee newsletter.

Where do the survey participants live?

Town of Onalaska residents had the greatest representation (15%), followed by the Town of Holland (11%) and City of La Crosse (9%). The remaining participants were spread relatively evenly across the county.

SURVEY RESULTS

The county is considering options to expand the number of ATV and UTV routes in La Crosse County. Which of the following options would you support?

Allow ATV and UTV routes to be expanded to all County Highways	61.96%
Expand ATV and UTV routes to most County Highways but exclude areas with the highest traffic	16.02%
Maintain the status quo, with new routes approved only after an application and review process	13.80%
Other (please explain)	8.22%

Note: Almost all the "other" responses were opposed to opening all county highways to ATV/UTV routes.

ANALYSIS

We can filter the data to show only the responses from the **276 participants** who reported not being ATV/UTV users. This would change the results as follows.

Can you summarize the open-ended responses?

- Participants who clicked the "other" option for the question on expanding routes were almost uniformly opposed to increasing ATV/UTV access. Opponents of expansion who provided a rationale for their stance cited safety for other motorists, pedestrians and cyclists as a primary concern, and several cited concerns over noise pollution.
- The final question in the survey asked participants to say what else they would like the county board to know about any possible expansion of ATV/UTV uses. 501 of the 950 participants answered this question.
- In response to the final question, many supporters cited economic benefits to the county due to an expected influx of ATV/UTV users if routes are expanded. Other supporters noted that in their view ATV/UTVs have good safety features, and that other counties have been expanding routes. Opponents cited safety as a concern, including for ATV/UTV users, while some also raised concern over liability issues/policing of ATV/UTV drivers.
