

Town Board Meeting; Monday, February 12, 2024

BOARD PRESENT: Chair Kevin Timm, Supervisors Chad Morris & Daren Schieldt

STAFF PRESENT: Clerk Jill Murphy

Call to Order: Chair Timm called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. Notices were posted.

Minutes: Motion by Morris/Schieldt to approve January 8 town board and Sp. mtg. minutes. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: January financial report was presented. Motion by Timm/Schieldt to approve. Motion carried.

Shelby Fire Dept: Chief Holinka unable to attend. Announcement of Shelby Fire Dept. Chicken-Q fundraiser March 17. Tickets are \$12.00.

Approve pay increase of Chief & Election Inspectors: Upon reviewing pay comparable with other county towns, and increased responsibility during elections, the clerk asked for pay increases for poll workers. Chief Inspectors to go from \$11.50 to \$15.00 and Inspectors from \$11.00 to \$11.50. Motion by Schieldt/Morris to approve. Motion carried.

Roads: Still waiting for info. in determining which rd. construction projects to tackle this yr. Will save discussion for next month. Road bans are on and stay on for 6 weeks at a time.

Summary of Sp. Mtg. discussions regarding La Crosse County & town opening rds. to UTV/ATV traffic: Timm stated an informal vote of residents present showed no opposition to the town board's recommendation to not oppose the county's proposal to open certain county rds. to UTV/ATV traffic.

*Citizen Concerns: Ken Schlimgen, county supervisor, stated agenda item being brought up at the Thursday mtg. is a pilot project of establishing a community review board which lets people lodge complaints against police officers and remain anonymous. Schlimgen stated he will vote against. Stated would recommend not doing the pitot project for the county. Concerns about which people would be appointed to this board and becoming a witch hunt against officers. Thinks the law says to face your accuser, and not remain anonymous. Asked anyone with a different opinion could reach out after the mtg. Ernie Komperud stated a concern about future snow plowing regarding the current warm weather. Timm stated the snow plows will go up/down middle areas and will stay away from the rd. edges to prevent tearing up.

Motion made by Morris/Schieldt to adjourn. Motion carried. Adjourned at 7:14 p.m.

Good morning Joe and thank you for sharing the latest proposal.

I will be out of the office beginning Friday, and through the 29th. My calendar is full until I leave. I do not anticipate having time to make comments on 7 routes during that time.

I will share this: The terrain, visibility, and traffic is very similar on all of our county highways except were they enter an urban area. There are stretches where traffic flow and visibility is good and stretches where they are narrow, no shoulder and no visibility.

As you are aware and I will share with this group... the Sheriff's Office will not have any increased presence for ATV's on our roads. We will respond to complaints (trespassing, reckless use, speed) when they occur and will address the same if they are observed by a deputy on routine patrol. A couple of areas the Sheriff's Office will not address if we receive complaints is noise and volume of ATV/UTVs on the roadways. Those types of concerns would have been taken into consideration by the county board in designating the roadway as a route. We are hopeful that ATV/UTVs, vehicles, pedestrians and bicycles can all safely share our roadways. The Sheriff's Office will be doing a series of video PSAs on summer safety. They will include awareness on bicycles and ATV/UTVs.

Please reach out anytime with concerns. I appreciate the strong partnership between the Sheriff' Office and Highway Department

Minutes

 Chairman Don Numsen called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Also present were Supervisor Mark Spears, Supervisor Justin Peterson, Treasurer Denise Payne, and Clerk Louisa Peterson. There were 17 guests.

Quorum was established. Agenda posted at Town Hall and on website: townofbangor.com Courtesy Posting: Log Cabin

2. Approval of the Agenda

MOTION Numsen/SECOND Spears. VOTE: MOTION UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED

- 3. Items needing Approval
 - a. Approve Regular Meeting Minutes March 18, 2024, 7pm
 MOTION Spears/SECOND Peterson. VOTE: MOTION UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED
 - Approve Current Disbursements Checks 3542-3559, 2 ACH for a total of \$14,570.43
 (including a previously approved check reissued in the amount of \$6,906.0) MOTION

 Numsen/SECOND Spears. VOTE: MOTION UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED
 - c. Approve Current Treasurer's Report as read. Deposits totalled \$18,878.28. There is one outstanding check for \$17. Available balance at First National Bank \$279,237.38. Loan balance is \$175,301.87. Investments of 2 CDs total \$100,000.

MOTION Peterson/SECOND Numsen. VOTE: MOTION UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED

- 4. Reports and Correspondence
 - a. Supervisor Peterson provided an update on the recent Fire Department meeting. They
 will apply for a grant for safety gear. Also a call for help, they're short on members.
 Finally, a comment that the recent fire in the Village of Bangor had an hour delay
 because of the time it took to get the power disconnected.
 - b. Clerk Peterson provided an election update. 129 ballots cast in the Town on April 2, a 35% turnout.
- 5. Unfinished Business
 - a. Commercial Building Code Standards for the Town of Bangor were discussed again.
 Supervisor Peterson apologized he was not ready to discuss. He wanted to investigate and contact other communities before the Town implemented new standards.
 - b. Road Work was discussed for 2024. Chairman Numsen provided an update with the Ho-Chunk Nation, they were willing to contribute/reimburse the Town for \$200,000 of improvements on Kale and Jackpot roads. A cooperative agreement was reviewed, changes were proposed and Clerk Peterson will send it back to the Ho-Chunk Nation. Road review was rescheduled for April 16, 2024 9am. Results will be discussed at the Annual Meeting that evening.
 - c. A new lawn mower and trailer purchase was discussed. Clerk Peterson noted that there was \$11,000 in the budget for the purchase and provided historical expenses of \$2174 in 2021, \$487 in 2022 and \$1010 in 2023. Supervisor Peterson and Supervisor Spears discussed the tradeoffs of labor and equipment. Decision forthcoming in May.

6. New Business

a. Ashley and Tyler Buchner came before the board to discuss a parcel split that will combine parts of 1-416-0 and 1-413-1 for the placement of a new home close to existing

home, but set back further fromState Road 162. They are pursuing an Administrative Conditional Use permit to get a rezoning designation from agriculture to residential. Board was supportive of the project as well as a deed restriction on the larger farm tract. Buchners indicated that the plan was to eventually remove the farm house very close to the road, but were not committal to a timeline.

- b. Recycling Center was discussed. Out of hours dumping is more prevalent and Chairman Numsen and Supervisor Peterson will meet a fencing company to discuss options. New signage has been printed at each access. Also a new attendant will need to be hired, long time attendant Howard Kniefl has retired.
- c. Ben Sullivan was not present to discuss his storage shed setback request.
- d. Dan Hesse of Coulee Cruisers UTV/ATV Club was present to discuss Town's opinion to access County Roads I, II, and JB. The listed roads are the last county roads in the Township that have not been opened, along with the Town roads that come off from those County Roads. MOTION Peterson/SECOND Numsen to advise County Highway Department of Town support of opening County Road I, II, JB routes for UTV/ATV traffic. VOTE: 2 AYE, 1 abstain, MOTION PASSED. Route ordinance to be updated at the May meeting.

8. Public Comments.

- a. Alan (Chip) Shilling asked the Town Board to repair the end of Larson Road for damages sustained while plowing snow. He cited it was on private property. Supervisor Spears said the town was not likely to repair chip seal but would provide materials as needed. Supervisor Peterson said that it would be considered during the Road Review. No action taken.
- b. Mrs. Patty Clark-Pierce asked why the Commercial Building Codes were tabled yet again. Supervisor Peterson stated that there wasn't a full board present in March and they weren't ready to move forward in April. She followed up asking goals and who would oversee. Response from Supervisor Peterson was that General Engineering Company, the Town's residential building inspector, would also be able to handle the commercial building inspections.
- 9. Chairman Numsen adjourned the meeting at 7:44pm.

Town of Washington, La Crosse County

The Town of Washington held a Special Meeting for residents on Monday, March 11th 2024, for the sole purpose of providing a "Public Hearing" regarding the opening of the La Crosse County Trunk highway system located within town boundaries to ATV/UTV traffic. Preparation for this Special Meeting began at our February Town Board meeting. The Town Board wished to provide a platform for full transparency and awareness. To achieve this goal the Town not only posted the meeting notice on the (3) normal meeting posting sites, we also included the notice on our web page. Additionally, we mailed the notice to all tax parcels holders of record along with our email address, so residents would have the ability to comment in the event they were not able to attend. I would like to report that the majority of electronic response was positive to both items listed on the notice. During the Special meeting we held a hearing on each item, I asked for a poll on residents in attendance on both questions and a super majority of those in attendance were in favor of the request to open the public road system to ATV/UTV traffic.

The Town of Washington would like to go on record of a recommendation that all La Crosse County Highways located within our municipality be opened to ATV/UTV vehicles. The residents also supported with a super majority to begin the process to open all Town Roads to UTV/ATV traffic. It was the general feeling that the Town of Washington wishes to be consistent with its surrounding communities are now open. Opening these roads to ATV/UTV traffic allows more traffic into local businesses which generates revenue. Rural residents who live along county roads would have access to the St. Joseph's Ridge or the Village of West Salem for gas and food. Additionally, they would connect our area to the neighboring villages of Bangor, Barre Mills, or Coon Valley which would then tie into Vernon, Monroe and Jackson Counties, bringing more business from those areas into the area and also allow local riders to tie into other trail systems without having to trailer their ATV/UTV to the areas. It is important to keep in mind that connections to "existing routes" not only include other county roads, but routes established currently or in the near future by local townships.

We have included the required forms from the county, maps of the requested county roads, and meeting minutes from the town of Washington, showing that a public meeting has been held prior to Board action.
