La Crosse County wants to help your business grow!

Program Purpose

This program exists to provide financial resources to businesses that are poised for growth, and encourage them to be innovative in the development of new products and the establishment of new markets for their existing products.

- Expand product base through research, testing, and/or new product development;
- Expand market base through enhanced planning and marketing activities;
- Diversify market base by expanding into different markets;

Preference will be given to projects that increase sales outside the region and show minimal adverse impact on existing local businesses.

Program Eligibility

To be eligible, a business must:

- Be located or plan to locate in La Crosse County
- Have 250 or less employees

Grant Specifics

- \$1,000 to \$10,000 grant;
- Projects must begin after grant award agreement is signed and be completed within 12 months;
- Projects must include at least 100% cash match of County grant funds;
 - Applications with at least 50% cash match may be considered if other program goals are met;
 - At least 50% of cash match must come from applicant, and the the remaining could come from a 3rd party;
- Applicants that show that they have used other non-profit entrepreneurial resources will receive preference;
- Applications must have clearly defined projects with clearly stated outcomes.



Process

Completed applications should be returned to the address on the back.

Applications will be reviewed by the review team, which will make a rec-ommendation to the La Crosse County Economic Development Fund (LCEDF) Board, which meets on the 1st Thursday of each month.

Applicants may be asked to make a presentation to the LCEDF Board.

Application review and consideration will generally take between 30 and 60 days.
