- participate in opportunities for volunteer reception center support, shelter support, mass clinic support and a variety of other preparedness and response topics.

Who can join?

Medical and non-medical volunteers*:

- to promote/provide public health and safety education/activities in our communities.
 - Stop the Bleed
 - Compression-only CPR
 - AED use
- to train and exercise for response to a public health emergency when called to assist local health and safety officials.

Medical

Physicians, nurses, dentists, behavioral health professionals, pharmacists, veterinarians, epidemiologists, and emergency medical providers.

Non-medical

Interpreters, chaplains, legal advisors, educators, information technology, military staff, amateur radio, clerical, food service, childcare providers, etc.

* Volunteers must by 18 years of age.
