What is Medication Management?

Medication Management is one of the thirteen psychosocial rehabilitative services that can be provided through the CCS program. Medication Management has two sub-categories of focus:

1. Medication Management for Prescribers

This is a medical evaluation service provided by licensed medical practitioners who assist with diagnosing symptoms, writing prescriptions for psychotropic medications to target mental health and substance use symptoms, monitoring changes in symptoms and measuring data to inform medical decisions.

2. Medication Management for Non-Prescribers

This is a skill/education based service that may be provided by anyone with knowledge and training in medication support type services. Non-prescriber services have a focus of assisting the individual become independent in self-administering their own medications. This may include assisting the individual develop methods to take their medications independently, monitor and track their own side effects, assist the individual understand what medications they are taking, when to take them, and benefits of keeping consistent with their prescriptions. Within the CCS program, medication management **cannot** include administering medication or observing medication compliance/medication passes.

Policy Primer

Progress Note Requirements (Medical Assistance)

All CCS progress notes (regardless of service array category) must include:

1. Data demonstrating Progress related to the measureable service plan Treatment Objective
2. Description of the individual's Level of Functioning and Quality of Life Functioning to support the further assessment of needs and service planning

1. Social Functioning with Peers (74%)

4. Anger Control/Expression (60%)
5. Adjustment to a Traumatic Event (57%)

Top 5 Identified Caregiver Needs

1. Managing Family Stress (40%)
2. Social Resources & Supports (37%)
3. Adequate Supervision/Childcare (34%)
4. Managing Own Mental Health (29%)
5. Knowledge/Empathy of Child Needs (21%)
