## FEEDLOT PLAN REQUIREMENTS

Feedlot plans must include the following information prior to review by the Department.

- 1. A completed application form, including the necessary information and signatures.
- 2. Animal Unit Calculation Sheet including the number and types of all animals.
- 3. A site plan drawn, at a legible scale, of the proposed livestock operation location including identification of all buildings, proposed construction, surface flow patterns, navigable and intermittent streams, and wetlands or water bodies within five hundred (500) feet of the proposed feedlot, livestock operation or livestock structure.
- 4. Proposed construction and structural details of the proposed livestock operation, including but not limited to dimensions, cross sections, concrete thickness, reinforcement schedules, and etc.
- 5. The location of wells within three hundred (300) feet of the feedlot.
- 6. Provisions for drainage and control of runoff to prevent pollution of surface water and groundwater such that the runoff meets the requirements of 23.08 of the Animal Manure Management Ordinance.
- 7. The location and type of vegetation / groundcover between feedlot and adjacent water bodies.
- 8. The scale of the drawing and the north arrow.
- 9. A time schedule for construction.
- 10. Location and type of Best Management Practices (BMP's) and any documentation necessary for design specifications.
- 11. A Department approved "Operation and Maintenance Plan" for the feedlot and any associated BMP's.
- 12. A Nutrient Management Plan is required and must be submitted to the Department annually.
