

How Do I Participate?

- Register on our website lacrossecountylibrary.org or at any of our five locations.
- Set your reading goals. See below for examples, but feel free to be creative and do what works for you!
- Read and enjoy visits to the Reading Celebration Station, where you'll find reading rewards based on where you are on the trail.
 - *Watch our website and social media sites for up-to-date information on programs.

Reading Goal Examples

The key is to encourage library usage and reading throughout the whole summer, not to complete the Reading Trail in one week — or not be able to finish at all.

ð	by Time?
•	Be read to minutes a day.
•	Read for minutes a day.
•	Read minutes to my grown-up and they will read minutes to me.
•	Read minutes this summer. (Divide by 55, the number of footprints sets, to determine a daily minute goal.)

	by Book?
•	Be read picture books a day.
•	Read chapters a day.
•	Read a different type of book for every section along the trail as you go. (mystery, sci fi, historical fiction, nonfiction, etc.)
•	Read pages a night.
•	Read books this summer. (Divide by 55, the number of footprint sets, to determine a daily book goal.)

OR - Come up with your own!

Activity* List:

Complete five activities* from the list below. Write the number of each completed activity in one of the blue campfire circles on the other side of this Reading Record. *They can be completed in any order.*

- 1. Create a diorama and a description of the scene to display at the library. It can be a forest, underwater, desert, jungle, or other scene.
- Sing an animal song (You can write your own!)
 about a pet or a wild animal. You can have
 someone record it for you or sing it live!
- 3. Listen to an audiobook, or read a book on Overdrive or Hoopla, our digital library apps.
- Write a story or comic strip about an animal adventure, and bring it to the library to display.
- 5. Go on an outdoor alphabet hunt.
- 6. Attend a library event!
- Read a magazine.
- 8. Put on a play with animal puppets.
- 9. Read in a fun place like under a tree or in a tent with a flashlight.
- 10. Read a nonfiction book about animals.
- 11. Tell a library person about a book you've read.
- 12. Explore a book that teaches you how to do something new. Try it and tell us about it!
- 13. Complete a Creation Station project, available at any of our five locations.
