The AmeriCorps Mobility Manager will support regional mobility by assisting residents with navigating local transportation services, promoting transit options, strengthening coordination among agencies, and helping advance regional mobility initiatives. Duties include community outreach, rider support, trip planning, development of transit education materials, data collection, and support for collaborative transit projects and planning efforts.

This is a half time AmeriCorps position averaging 18 hours per week, hours are flexible based on project needs and community activities.

LAPC Mobility Manager – (AmeriCorps Community Corps)

Position Details

- Half-time AmeriCorps role (about 18 hours/week).
- Serves La Crosse County, the La Crosse Area Planning Committee (MPO), and the City of La Crescent.
- Focuses on improving regional mobility, rider support, outreach, and transit coordination.

Key Responsibilities

- Lead outreach, education, and marketing for regional transit services (MTU, Driftlink, etc.).
- Create accessible materials such as brochures, digital content, and social media posts.
- Help residents navigate transportation options across multiple agencies and providers.
- Provide individualized trip planning, especially for riders with complex mobility needs.
- Coordinate with transit providers, human-service agencies, nonprofits, and municipal partners.
- Maintain and update mobility and human-services transportation coordination plans.
- Collect and analyze mobility-related data to identify unmet needs and system gaps.
- Represent mobility initiatives at community events and meetings.
- Support travel-training programs for fixed-route, demand-response, and microtransit services.
- Assist with Regional Transit Authority (RTA) education and coordination activities.

Desired Skills & Qualifications

- Interest in transit, mobility coordination, outreach, or community/urban planning. Experience in transit not required and will learn in the position.
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to create clear and accessible outreach materials.
- Solid organizational skills; comfortable managing activities across multiple agencies.
- Familiarity with social media or basic design tools (preferred).
- Commitment to improving transportation access for seniors, individuals with disabilities, low-income residents, and underserved populations.
